

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

Preparing To Face-Off

- Devotion to the divine destiny God has for you gives Him glory, benefits humanity, and provides you fulfillment!
 - Do you have a relationship with Yahweh, some other god, or no god at all?

 - How am I influencing others with my values and beliefs?
 - Is destiny preordained, a future fated to occur against our will?
 - How do I discover and adhere to my own God-ordained divine destiny?

THE FACE-OFF

Biblical divinity is directly associated with Yahweh, Lord-God. Anything that is considered to be divine derives from God, Himself. The excellent, delightful, providence of God is unmatched because Yahweh is the only entity in existence that was not created, and is all-powerful, all-knowing, and everywhere-always - the fullness of any animated creation. No other being in all of existence can claim any of these attributes outside of the triune God, Yahweh.

There is only one God, not three, who exists eternally as the Triune God. He reveals Himself as three distinct persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—sharing one divine essence. One God in three persons. Because we are the creation of such a supreme deity, we should choose to honor Yahweh by devoting our lives to His perfect will.

Ephesians 2:10 reveals the intention behind God making us in His image: "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them". Knowing this, we can confidently search out and accept the good, purposeful, and fulfilling divine destiny that the Lord has prepared for us to thrive in.

What events and rewards has God prepared for you to fulfill and acquire? With the God-given liberty of choice, we have permission to say "yes" or "no" when God calls on us to act. He allows us to accept the purpose He, as our divine Creator, has arranged for us to carry out. If we truly love the Lord, we will wisely accept His perfect plan for our lives. This doesn't mean that we robotically enact momentary commands but that we submit our paths to His plans.

Choosing to surrender our will to the Lord, grants us grace to accomplish great things that we would otherwise fail to discover or fulfill. God often gives us an overarching idea or special tasks that

permit us to creatively conduct and manage our destiny decisions within the range of His grace and instruction. To reject God's way of doing things is to rebel against His infinite wisdom, thus submitting yourself to the consequences of removing yourself from His boundaries of grace and safety.

So no, devotion isn't blind obedience. By reading the Bible, praying, fellowshipping with true believers, and asking God for revelation, you will enter into an intimate relationship with the all-powerful Lord-God, Yahweh. In doing so, your thinking, attitude, and behavior will become refined; and so too will be your discernment of His intentions concerning you. Yes, the King of the Universe wants to maintain a close relationship with you and I. In His presence is how we discover and enact our divine destiny.

Important Tip

What kind of communicator should you be?

Prayer is simply a conversation with the LORD. Holding an engaging conversation means that both participants are willing to take turns listening and speaking. Think about when you converse with someone. You feel validated when they quietly contemplate your words, maintaining eye contact or reading your lips, making sure not to miss a single detail.

Time spent in prayer with your heavenly Father should resemble that same intimacy and absorption. Of course, you can speak to God any place, anytime. However, each day we must establish intentional times where we hide away from all distractions. In this quiet and private place we can truly relax, basking in the presence of our beloved Savior.



Chapter 1:

Divine Destiny

Divine Destiny: The Greater and Lesser

Divine destiny is not about individual abilities or self-centered pursuits but about fulfilling the purpose of the Creator who uniquely crafted us for His glory. The Bible consistently directs us to focus on God's supremacy over our lives rather than seeking self-defined purpose. This alignment is essential because our purpose and destiny are intrinsically tied to our relationship with Yahweh, the Sovereign Lord. True soul searching, then, becomes an exercise in understanding our connection to God, rather than a quest for personal fulfillment.

Understanding Destiny Through Scripture

God's Word reveals the principles of divine destiny by emphasizing a relationship with Him that enables us to discern His will. While modern culture often views destiny as a self-driven journey, Scripture clarifies that our ultimate purpose is to glorify Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. As 1 Timothy 2:1-8 illustrates, God desires all people to come to a knowledge of truth through Christ. This truth eliminates alternative paths to eternity and underscores the exclusivity of Jesus as the one mediator between God and humanity, a foundational truth for aligning our lives with His will.

The Greater and Lesser Divine Destiny

Scripture presents two dimensions of divine destiny: the "greater" and the "lesser." The greater destiny is our higher calling to glorify God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, as Jesus describes in Mark 12:28–30. This overarching purpose reflects complete obedience and devotion to God as His beloved creation. The lesser destiny, derived from the greater, involves loving others as ourselves (Mark 12:31) and serving

humanity through Christ's love. These dimensions are interconnected, emphasizing that our relationship with God is the foundation for how we engage with others in love and humility.

Living Out Purpose and Destiny

Walking in divine destiny requires prioritizing God's glory and serving others. It is not complicated but grounded in obedience and love. Our purpose is revealed through the gifts and talents God has entrusted to us, while our destiny unfolds in the events God orchestrates for His plans (Ephesians 2:10). Although challenges and distractions arise, we are called to remain steadfast, relying on God's strength. By surrendering ungodly habits and embracing godly principles, we grow into servant-leaders who glorify God in every aspect of life. Through perseverance and faith, we can fulfill the divine destiny that God has lovingly prepared for us.


