

Where we feel comfort, we deposit our trust.



Important Tip

Chapter 1:

The Powers That Be

Masculinity isn't about overpowering others. A man's true strength isn't based on our physical prowess and isn't derived from excellent gym ethic. Though taking proper care of our body's is important because a believer's body is a holy temple of the One True God, a man's true strength is the result of seeking and maintaining a dynamic relationship with Jesus Christ. By way of submission to Jesus, His Holy Spirit will come to dwell within us, empowering us with the *dunamis* power that glorifies God and benefits mankind.

A man's natural strength is a gift but not intended for abuse or manipulation. In many passages, the Bible condemns violence, especially against other believers. Violence and deception is never an option for a godly man because these things are an offense against God and humanity. Self-defense and combat have their place but violence that stems from wickedness has its roots in moral deviation. Instead of attempting to man-handle life, people, and circumstances, a godly man will do his best to establish and maintain a lifestyle that complements the will and intent of the Lord's standard for His sons. Self-discipline is holding oneself accountable without the need for clothes to rebuke or correct ungodly behavior. Power is not a license to destroy but should be a life-saving tool mastered and used by its host to elevate righteousness and diminish evil.

Keep in mind that true strength, the dunamis power of God is not just for personal use. Do not grieve the Holy Spirit by oppressing anyone with your physical strength. But be drunk with power in the Holy Spirit,

remaining constantly under the influence of the Lord's inspiration.

Dunamis power isn't a natural phenomena but can greatly affect the natural realm. It is a supernatural ability to pull on resources from the spirit realm to apply in the natural.

Remaining mindful of Jesus' words and deeds, our thought patterns and behaviors should reflect the Lord's high moral standards. In doing so, we can be trusted as proficient stewards over our spiritual gifts and the people God has entrusted into our care. Miracles, morality, influence, affluence, and social reform are all the results of living in the power of our God-given purpose.

Chapter 2:

Lovely Lord

1 Corinthians 13:4–8 does a fine job of detailing the biblical definition of love. Today, love is often used in ways that strips its intent and impact of the words truth and essence. We use love in a devalued way that almost mocks God as Love, itself. The Lord is not just the personification of love but the literal and kinetic identity of love. Love is not just an action word but a Person. Though love is reduced by some to a form of sexual expression, infatuation, or perverted interest; love is in fact the driving force behind humanity's creation and preservation in Christ.

The Lord is lovely because He is Love and His attributes are a natural extension of this expression. Knowing that real love doesn't exist outside of God, Who is the actualized definition and embodiment of love, should help us as believers to disassociate with any portrayal of love that doesn't align with what the Lord has established it to be in His Holy Word. In this way we learn that love always offers a choice and cannot, by definition, be given or received by force. Instead, being loved by Jesus compels us to love in return.

Living a life of selfless but wise love promotes us into restoration in the care of our heavenly Father. The more we pour out in accordance with the will of God's grace measured out to us, the greater the overflow the Lord pours back into us. Our expressions of love are not just spiritual but naturally practical. When we express the lovely tendencies that our Lord lavishes us with, those who feel forsaken or forgotten can turn to the light of Christ we emit; ultimately discovering comfort, ease, peace, and redemption in Jesus.

Free from the bondage of fear, love and hope begin to replace all of our anxieties, worries, and deficiencies. There is an unparalleled security in resting in our Lord and Savior. Empowered by the love of Jesus, we can conquer our own fears while helping others in being champions of fidelity and service to the body of Christ. By studying the love of Jesus, we learn how to discern between real love and secular desires. Surround yourself with wise mentors and friends who will be a benefit to your walk in godly love.

Pray along with me...

Jesus, You are such a lovely Lamb - the Sacrifice that changed it all. The second Adam, You gave up Your life in order that we might be saved and given eternal life. In Your resurrection, You split the veil between our sin and Your redemption. Thank You for washing us clean, as white as snow. Reveal to me the true meaning of love - the same love that You lavish us in as Your bride.

Help me to walk in the way of Your light.
Teach me how to love others the way You love me. Even when it is difficult to be kind and understanding with ourselves and others, please move me in the power of Your Holy Spirit so that I may sincerely forgive those who have offended me. Let Your love abound in me, overflowing like a river so that those You've entrusted to me may encounter You.

Because we are offended or hurt by family, friends, romantic partners, and even the church, we can have the tendency to apply that same mistrust towards others, even if they mean us no harm. Do you struggle with expressing love appropriately? If so, what issues do you need to overcome and what people must you forgive in order to love in confidence and not fear?

Do you find it difficult to love God or receive love from God because you don't feel you deserve love? If so, describe why you feel this way and then lay it at the Lord's feet in prayer, trusting that He has forgiven your sincere stance of repentance and loves you deeply regardless of whether you feel worthy or not. Remember, Jesus Christ has made you worthy of His love. ©

Has there been a time when you attempted to force someone to love you? Or perhaps there was someone who tried forcing you to love them in return? Describe this situation and what you learned from it. Do you still struggle with this issue today? If so, you owe it to yourself to heal. With God in your corner, you got this!

Are you currently struggling with a heartbreak? If so, though it may be
painful, meditate on what went wrong and what is truly holding you
back from healing and moving on. Think through every detail, asking
God to heal your heart from every issue. Make attempts at genuinely
forgiving that person and yourself, allowing the Holy Spirit to
empower that forgiveness.

Do you struggle with separating love from desire? Attraction doesn't make it love. It's especially easy to attach the feeling of pleasure or euphoria to the idea of love. However, passion isn't about sex, pleasure, or instant gratification but involves sacrifice, compromise, and understanding. Would you consider yourself to be a person who loves biblically or still wrestles with fleshly desires that attract you to counterfeit ideas of love? If so, describe your circumstance then write your own prayer, asking the Lord for discernment, self-control, and a desire for His will above your own.

In what ways do you serve others in the love of Christ? How has the
Lord influenced you to be a benefit to others? Do you help others
without wanting anything in return or do you expect some kind of
reciprocation, whether it be from God or people? If you don't serve
others, in what ways could you serve?

Have you intentionally designated a season to heal, learn, and recover from the things that seemingly hold you back or beat you down? We all need a season to ourselves to detox and gain a healthy
perspective on ourselves and others.

Does the fear of rejection ever prevent you from engaging in acts of kindness or expressing affection? If so, describe a situation in which this occurred. I encourage you to then practice small favors and tiny gestures of affection a bit at a time with those closest to you until you become more comfortable so that you can eventually also become a benefit to strangers that the Lord may lead you to assist.

Chapter 3:

A Safe And Sound Mind

To be a man of your word means that you not only mean what you say but have the ability to follow through on what you said. There are unfortunately people who say they'll do something but have already made up their mind to not follow through. Some lie to evade an immediate consequence. Some mean well but lack the time, strength, or resources to match their intent. Whatever the situation is, a lifestyle of well-wishes with no action is not worth living.

The virtue of being a reliable man is rare these days. We all have our priorities but who establishes those priorities and why makes a difference. In order to honor God and benefit our fellow man, we must hold ourselves accountable in accordance with the standard God has established for men to uphold. This means developing and maintaining a healthy partnership between the Holy Spirit and our own personal agendas.

Though the flesh resists the Spirit, we force our flesh into submission by consistently practicing the Word of the Lord. Lack of self-control is a burden that dismantles and destroys. But a heart set on the wisdom of the Holy Spirit empowers us to function at full capacity, effectively making a powerful difference. With discipline comes clarity, resolve, and momentum. Our behavior mustn't manipulate but motivate.

What kind of man are you? Do you lack self-control, self-discipline, and a sound mind? Don't torment yourself by being double-minded. You cannot serve God and flesh. Consider what type of example you want

to be for your loved ones. Think about how pleasing your behavior is to the Lord. Meditate on what the Bible says about living a life worthy of respect and honor. Review your ideals and adjust them accordingly.

Ponder the ways you exhibit self-control. Take into consideration how well you manage your physical movement, emotions, concentration, and impulses? Willpower isn't always enough to walk in dignity, discretion, and sobriety. It takes practice in step with the indwelling power of the Holy Spirit discerning traps and leading you away from temptation. Self-discipline and a sound mind helps us remain focused on our godly pursuits, even in the midst of our own weaknesses.

Chapter 4:

Authentic Masculinity Part 1

To be a man of your worWhether you are a father, husband, or single man who struggles with what it means to be a good man, remember that men and women were created as equals, each with roles that complement and support one another. As a husband and father, your responsibility is to lead your family in faith, nurturing a home grounded in love and reverence for God. Leadership in your home is not about power or control, but about providing for and protecting your family, ensuring that everyone under your care is spiritually and emotionally supported.

It's easy to fall into "Assumed Manhood," where certain traits—like pride or aggression—might seem masculine but actually go against God's intended design for men. True, Authentic Manhood reflects qualities of humility, strength, and service, aligned with God's purpose. As a father and husband, your role is to model this for your family, striving to pursue righteousness (1 Timothy 6:11), produce spiritual growth (Psalm 1:1-6), provide for your household (1 Timothy 5:7-8), and protect those you love (1 Corinthians 16:13-14).

Leading your family means more than just providing materially; it also involves speaking truth with patience and compassion, guiding your loved ones in a way that reflects God's love. As you strive to become the man, husband, and father that God has called you to be, remember that your strength lies not in domination but in serving your family and community through love, faith, and righteous leadership. Daily, ask yourself questions that encourage reflection on aligning personal masculinity with the spiritual and moral principles outlined in the text.

Chapter 5:

Don't be content with simply holding the position; make sure your actions reflect the ethics of true leadership. Reflect on the Four Essential Modes: Shares, which emphasize generosity and cooperation; Cares, which center on compassion and concern for others; Scares, which encourage courage in the face of fear; and Snares, which call for awareness of traps that can lead you astray. These reflections guide authentic leadership.

Finally, remember that only God can fill the deepest voids in your life. No amount of worldly success or material comfort can substitute for His presence. Assurance in God's promises gives you confidence in ultimate triumph and salvation, while the practical aspects of life, like insurance, help manage everyday challenges. But it is your trust in God's provision and guidance that will truly secure your heart and lead you to live out His purpose in your life. Meditate daily on scripture that encourages personal accountability and spiritual growth, helping you as a man to examine your leadership, faith, and reliance on God's guidance.

Chapter 6:

The Assurance Of Appreciating Assets

Men, whether as husbands, fathers, or individuals, it's essential to understand the difference between assurance and insurance in the context of our faith. Assurance represents a guaranteed, permanent condition of certainty, reflecting the unshakeable promises of Christ. Insurance, on the other hand, covers potential accidents or unforeseen events, offering compensation for likely occurrences. Both concepts involve agreements between a responsible party and a recipient, but in our relationship with Jesus, there is no risk—only the unwavering certainty of His promises and the eternal value He provides.

Jesus Christ is the ultimate authority whose guidance and promises are infallible and cosmic in scope. His relationship with us is the greatest appreciating asset, far surpassing any worldly insurance policy. Believers are endowed with the assurance and authority of God's power, granted through faith, to receive all He has promised. In Christ, we find a refuge that supports our character and stands firm against life's trials, emphasizing that our trust should be in His unchanging nature rather than temporary or subpar substitutes.

Maintaining faith under pressure requires discipline and a focus on principle over pain. Substance in our faith is crucial; it represents the true strength and refuge of our character. Ensure that your behavior and decisions reflect the substance of your faith, and avoid letting temporary discomfort overshadow the enduring principles of God's promises.
